

ATTAIN Study

Have you tried standard treatment for your hepatitis C, but found it didn't work well? Clinical research doctors are looking for people with hepatitis C to participate in a clinical research study.

This research study is evaluating an investigational drug intended to treat patients who are infected with hepatitis C. The study will determine the efficacy, safety and tolerability of an investigational drug (that is a drug still in development) compared to a US Health Authority (FDA) approved drug that is currently used as the standard of care treatment for your disease. You will receive one of these drugs at random (like flipping a coin); you have a 50% chance to receive either the investigational drug or the FDA approved drug.

Both are given together with a combination of two drugs (pegylated interferon and ribavirin), already used, to treat chronic hepatitis C infection. What's more, you will be contributing to hepatitis C research. You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Have been diagnosed with hepatitis C
- Have received at least one round of treatment for hepatitis C
- Are 18-70 years old

Additional criteria will be assessed by the study doctor to determine your eligibility. If you're interested and eligible, you may receive the following:

- No-cost investigational medication for hepatitis C or an FDA approved drug of the same class
- Study-related care from a local study doctor
- Compensation for study-related expenses
